COUNCIL CHAIRMAN 2011/2012

Councillor Bill Miller has been re-elected to the position of Chairman of Newby and Scalby Parish Council.



Cllr Miller has lived and farmed in the area for nine generations and has been at Linglands Farm, Cloughton for forty years. He has been a member of Newby and Scalby Parish Council since 2007 and was first elected Chairman in May 2010. He is a retired farmer and businessman and founded Specialist Recycling Services as part of farming diversification nineteen years ago.

Bill has experience as a former member of Scarborough Borough Council, North Yorkshire County Council and the North Yorks Moors National Park Authority.

For many years Bill served as a member and President of North Yorkshire Valuation Tribunal Service, is currently an executive member of the CPRE for North Yorkshire and for the last four years has been Waste Co-ordinator for the CPRE.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2010/2011

Fellow Councillors, Parishioners of Newby and Scalby, I am pleased to present my Chairman's Report for the year 2010-11.

Having had the honour of being elected by you in May 2010, it has been an enjoyable and challenging year with the Parish Council achieving many milestones.

Stage 1 of the refurbishments of the Parish Hall were completed.

A highly controversial planning application for approximately 500 new houses at High Mill was granted by Scarborough Borough Council—this proposed development remains of great concern to many residents.

A trust for the running and maintenance of the Parish Hall was formed on the advice and instruction of Scarborough Borough Council. This was a cause of some controversy between members, with many continuing to be of the view they have been bounced into this by Scarborough Borough Council.

Last June we celebrated a visit from our friends in Pornic, our Twin Town. Together with the Pornic Committee

CAP GROUP

There is a well established Community and Police Action Group which holds its meetings in the Community Hall

This is attended by residents and more importantly senior police officers who are responsible for the policing of our parish.

This meeting enables residents to raise their concerns on any policing issues from Anti-Social Behaviour, the risk of burglary or more serious crimes.

It provides useful and effective feedback from the community to the police and enables specific initiatives to be undertaken by the police to combat anti social behaviour and crime and make this a better place to live.

The good news is that reported crime in the area over

the last 12 months has reduced by 7% (214 crimes compared with 230). Better news still is the 22% reduction in reports of antisocial behaviour (down from 358 to 278).

LOCAL POLICE CONTACT

The Scarborough Safer Neighbourhood Team delivers community policing to the town and officers are allocated to areas based on Council ward boundaries. PC Howard Allison and PCSO Chris Hunter (right) cover Newby and up to Station Road at Scalby.



Below are some of our regular duties.

1. Patrols - We perform high visibility cycle patrol in the Newby and Scalby areas covering main roads, private residential and social housing estates, the corridor of the old Scarborough-Whitby railway line and local access points. Areas that are prioritised for regular patrol are known as hot spots and these are usually areas where anti-social behaviour (ASB) has been reported. A common ASB issue concerns the gathering of young people, particularly of secondary school age, which often leads to street drinking, rowdiness and some residents being targeted. A favourite meeting point at Newby is at The Croft in front of the takeaway outlets and here we have worked hard to engage with the local youngsters to divert them away from the area and break the cycle of ASB. This has brought about a reduction in the number of incidents reported, but the patrols will be maintained.

An area of concern which has been highlighted to the police lately is the amount of youths gathering on weekends in the woods surrounding Throxenby Mere. They are camping, making fires, drinking alcohol and leaving large amounts of rubbish behind. Our aim is to visit the area regularly and to speak to the youths, giving advice on the dangers of fires and tidying up after themselves. Alcohol will be removed from per-

sons causing any offences.

The banks of Scalby Beck (Sea Cut) are regularly patrolled due to past reports of ASB and illegal fishing.

2. School liaison - PCSO Hunter is the liaison officer for Newby Primary School and PC Allison for Scalby School. Talks are given to the younger children on 'stranger danger' and 'playing safe'. To make sure that we have high visibility for the pupils and for their families, we try to be present in the vicinity of our schools at the relevant times. This provides a point of contact, traffic management and where necessary, a public order deterrent. We work in joint-agency partnership with our schools to address any crime or disorder issues which may arise.

3. Regular visits - We personally follow-up all reports of crime and anti-social behaviour by re-contacting victims and, where appropriate, visiting. We monitor repeat victims and if vulnerable we assess how to manage them and respond to their needs. We make visits to local off-licences to deter youths from attempting to buy alcohol, also to prevent "randomers" from being persuaded to buy alcohol for people who are underage. Staff are reminded of their responsibilities, to challenge anyone who looks under 21 and ensure they provide identification. The Streetsafe Project where we perform joint patrols with youth workers, targets underage drinkers and results in many seizures of alcohol as well as offering diversionary activities

4. Youth contact - PCSO Hunter regularly visits the Youth Café on Moor Lane to maintain contact and support to the local element and to give them advice on issues they may have. Also the youths know that this is a regular point he visits so it is a main point of contact for them to see him. He has approached the Parish Council on behalf of the Newby youths to request funding for goal posts.

5. Public surgeries - We conduct monthly drop-ins which are advertised in the local press and on our website. We occasionally have access to the Safer Communities trailer which we occupy for the purpose of ward priority surveys, bike security marking and general consultation. We report to the Community and Police Group quarterly meetings at Scalby Parish Hall.

SCARBOROUGH RUGBY CLUB

Scarborough Rugby Club has been part of the Newby and Scalby parish scene since around the middle of the last century and, since moving to its new site at Silver Royd just north of Scalby from the showground on Scalby Road in January 2009, has become a hub of sporting activity in the Parish and the town.

Running a total of eighteen teams ranging from mini-rugby for seven year olds to a veterans fifteen (which includes at least one player still going strong in his seventies), rugby is the *raison d'être* for the club's existence.

The playing and training facilities are a hive of activity during the rugby season which runs from August to May. Senior rugby takes place on Saturdays and rugby for ages 7 to 18 on Sundays.

Scarborough RUFC's 'Baron's' sports and fitness centre is open daily with extensive gym facilities and squash courts. There is also a full size sports hall catering for 5 a side football, badminton, netball, basketball and many other sports. The complex also boasts indoor cricket nets and two excellent squash courts.

The club's social facilities which include three bars, sponsors lounges and the Qdos Suite, are in great demand and are much sought after venues for weddings, parties, etc.

DIAL A RIDE COMMUNITY TRANSPORT

Dial A Ride is a local, independent charity offering door-to-door, fully accessible transport on a daily basis in a 9 mile radius of Scarborough and Filey. We can be used by anyone over retirement age, people who have any sort of disability or mobility problem, or residents of rural areas whose area is not served by public transport and do not have access to a car. So you don't have to be elderly or need to use a wheelchair to enjoy the benefits of Dial A Ride!

Our 10 minibuses are either low floor or are fitted with hydraulic lifts or ramps as well as low steps and grab rails for ease of boarding. The buses can accommodate most types of wheelchairs (electric and manual) and can also carry motorised scooters, although passengers must dismount their scooters before getting on the bus and cannot sit on them whilst travelling.

Dial A Ride also has a smaller MPV vehicle available for those longer journeys to such as hospitals in York, Leeds, Hull or the North East. It has room for 3 seated passengers and a space for a wheelchair user and is available for any length of journey, seven days a week.

If you are eligible for Dial A Ride, then you can use us for any reason. For example shopping, visiting friends or relatives, going to church; day centres; pubs and restaurants; training, leisure and educational pursuits as well as keeping any sort of health related appointments. You can bring a friend, carer or relative with you on your journey at an additional flat fare of just £2.00

Our minibuses (with driver) are also available for hire by eligible groups who want to organise day excursions or short trips (max capacity 14 seated passengers) and if you want to travel further afield, we will try our best to help.

We do employ some paid drivers, but rely on our volunteer drivers and passenger escorts to keep Dial A Ride 'on the road'. We receive just 15% of our income from annual grants, the rest we have to generate ourselves through fares, fundraising and donations.

All our drivers, both paid and voluntary, are MiDAS assessed (Minibus Driver Assessment Scheme) and receive training in first aid as well as many other areas of passenger safety comfort and awareness. All members of staff have to undergo an enhanced Criminal Record Bureau Check.

To make a booking, simply telephone the office on 01723 354434. The first time you call, we will take all necessary details. There is a small annual membership fee of £3 to pay plus your fare. Then, you simply need to tell us when and where you want to go—leave the rest to us!
